Storing Stuff?

Storage buildings "...shall be walled in or kept screened by adequate planting, walls or other means in such manner as to conceal them from the view of the neighboring lots, streets, or from the view of the golf course property." A note about Trailers...

"No temporary house or trailer... shall be placed or erected on the lots..." Please remember that if you choose to keep a recreational trailer or any other type of trailer on your lot it must be stored OUT OF SIGHT in either your garage or in your backyard so as not to be seen from the street or by your neighbors.

IRI Update

As many of you may have noticed the course is in beautiful shape. Despite a few frost delays playing golf at the Forty Niners is ideal right now. We have the new greens keeper Gordon Byrnes to thank for that. He has been taking care of the 49ers course for about 6 months now and his care and dedication to the course is obvious.

A few noteworthy topics regarding the course. Hole number 6 is completely drained and ready to be made into a hazard area. To achieve this IRI will be gently sloping the sides of the pond and filling the bottom with decomposed granite. As the appropriate season approaches, the slopes of the pond will be seeded with grass. There will also be a few mounds of dirt topped with fountain grass in the center to warn approaching golfers of the hazard.

IRI added a few more carts, bringing the total to 72. This results in the ability of a few more tee times!

Another concern IRI is addressing the condition of the sand traps. As it is not feasible at this time to empty and reconstruct the sand traps, IRI is taking measures to try and improve them by removing the grass and sifting out the rocks. This should make your time in the sand all that more enjoyable.

Do Your Lights Trespass?

Have you been thinking of adding or replacing some exterior lights around your home? Did you know that you may need to use special light fixtures that control light pollution?

It's true. Our 49er neighborhood lies in a special lighting zone around Mt. Lemmon called "E3a." This zone falls under Pima County's Outdoor Lighting Code and affects the construction, alteration, movement, enlargement, replacement and installation of outdoor lighting!

The purpose of this Outdoor Lighting Code is to preserve our relationship to our unique desert environment. This will support astronomical activity, minimize wasted energy, control the obtrusive aspects of excessive and careless outdoor lighting; and preserve, protect, and enhance the lawful nighttime use and enjoyment of any and all property.

"How can we help accomplish this in our neighborhood?"

By using the right light fixtures! Before we discuss what a "right" light looks like, let's first understand a few components of light pollution:

Glare. Glare from a light blinds us and harms visibility. Glare is never good.

Light Trespass. This is when someone's outdoor lights offend us, "trespassing" on our land.

Clutter. This "trashes" the nighttime

environment, and causes confusion for wildlife.

Lights that shine "out" and/or "up" are lights that pollute our skies. Lights that shine "down" help us preserve our dark skies. A good rule of thumb is that if you position yourself just below eye-level with a light fixture and can still see the light bulb, chances are it is NOT dark sky compliant!

If you are not ready to replace your existing fixtures just yet, consider using a lower wattage light bulb in certain fixtures. Remember that exterior landscape lighting probably does not require that same 60-100watt light bulb that we need when reading the newspaper inside our home.

Do you have those motion-sensing "security lights"? You can still make them dark sky compliant. First, aim the lights at less than a 45-degree angle. Second, consider the use of a shield like that from www.parshield.com.

For more information on this important topic, visit the International Dark-Sky Association at www.darksky.org. Once there you can also find a list of manufactures that sell dark sky compliant lights. Tips from the Sheriff Department's Community Liaison

Area Leader Claire Place recently had a conversation with the Sheriff Department's Community Liaison, when following up on an area incident. Here are some important pointers on safety awareness that are worth being reminded of, and some you may not have heard before:

- 1 - Check window and door locks after service contractors have entered your home. They have the opportunity to unlock them when you are unaware, and may return later to burglarize your home.
- 2 - If an individual approaches you or your home in an unmarked vehicle, or as a plainclothes police officer or sheriff's deputy, ALWAYS VERIFY his or her information BEFORE giving any information, or allowing entry to your home.
- 3 - Verify an officer's information by calling 9-1-1 with his/her name and badge number.
- 4 - "Target harden" your home, making it harder for burglars to gain entry. Think lighting, landscaping, locks, alarm systems, or even just alarm signs, etc.
- 5 - For your personal protection keep doors and windows locked especially when you are home. Auxiliary locks are easily purchased at local hardware stores. For older windows, bars behind tracks or screws placed inside tracks are also a good deterrent.

New Neighborhood Watch Signs are Here!

The Pima County Sheriff's Department, in conjunction with the Pima County Department of Transportation, has installed our newly designed Neighborhood Watch signs! The previous sign was "Boris the Burglar" and "Neighborhood Watch." The new sign is much more eye-catching, and includes the Pima County Sheriff's emblem. Anyone entering our neighborhood will notice this sign immediately. As in the past, the sign is a deterrent to criminals and criminal activity and serves as a reminder to report suspicious activity.
